- 1. President Mr. Bennet Gamlath called the meeting to order and invited the house to rise for the National Anthem. Thereafter, the Incoming President Mr.Kapiala Ranasinghe was invited to garland the photo of the Founder Member of the Members Benevolent Society Mr. D.S.R.Tharmaratnam and requested the members to observe a silence of one minute in remembrance of all the deceased members.
- 2. The Minutes of the last AGM were circulated among the members and it was presented by Hon. Secretory Mr. Thushara Kariyawasam. Mr.K.S.Welivita proposed that the minutes were in order and Mr. W D L Dushmantha seconded.
- 3. Thereafter, President invited Hon. Treasurer Mr. Gamini Samarasekara to submit the financial statements of year 2018 to the members. Mr. Gamini Samarasekara presented the summary of the financial statement which were already circulated to the members. Afterward, the President requested for the financial statements to be adopted by the members and Mr. Abseil proposed and Mr. Aruna Rathnaweera seconded
- 4. Thereafter, the President, Mr. Bennet Gamlath addressed the members, and briefed them on the success of the year of the Society whilst drawing attention to the followings;
 - Mr. President appreciated the contribution made by all members from the inception and special thanks to founder member of the society Mr. D.S.R.Tharmaratnam
 - Significant number of registration of new members was recorded in the year under review and the President stressed on the need to increase membership further.
 - Mr. President appreciated the assistance provided by the committee in organizing events such as the Sinhala/Tamil new year celebrations, guest lectures, members day outing, Kavi maduwa, Paduru Party and other activities of the Society.
 - He further mentioned that the earnings from the Members' Fund were not used for any of the welfare activities carried out during the year and that the majority of the events were funded through the sponsorships brought and other fund raising activities in by the committee members.
 - President informed that special discount schemes are organized from Lanka Hospitals and Durdance hospitals to help members to take care of their health.
 - President stressed that young members needs to attract to our society. He proposed to change of patterns of the activities carried out by the society to attract the new members

with value added sessions for which CPD hours are granted. Further he suggest to change the name of the society too.

- The President concluded his remarks thanking the Council Members, Institute Staff and the Committee Members and administrative secretory Mr. K.Manivanan for their support.
- 5. President presented the Resolution to Increased death donation to members It was proposed by Mr. Quintus Fernando and seconded Mr. Gamini Samarasekara

Nomination Papers were received only for 8 committee members and two position was vacant and President invited the members to fill the other vacancy. Then Mr. Anil proposed Mr.O.R Ranasinghe as committee member and Mr.Srilal seconded the same. Thereafter Mr. Hasitha Kalansuriya proposed Mr.D.C.Hettiarachchi as committee Member and Mr.Thiyag araja seconded the same.

- 7. The outgoing Auditors M/s B R De Silva and Company (Chartered Accountants) having consented to be reappointed, were appointed as Auditors of the Society for the 2016/17 as well. Mr. Rajeew proposed the name of the Auditor and Mr. A. Rathnaweera seconded.
- 8. President elect Mr. B K K Ranasinghe was invited to address the forum and he stressed that young members are not taken part in our society activities. He stressed that our activities should be directed to attract new members and suggest changing the name of the society. He requested members' suggestion to change the name and proposed names. He requested support of the institute to enhance the support to needy members and requested to increase institute contribution to Rs.1 Mn.

He proposed to change of patterns of the activities carried out by the society to attract the new members with value added sessions for which CPD hours are granted and proposed to have a link with YCAP.

He assured the members to enhance benevolent activities in 2019 and requested the fullest support of the newly elected committee and the general membership to carry out the activities of the society.

9. President opens the forum for members to express their views and ideas. Mr.Quintes Fernando Congratulated to the new President and the committee. Further he mentioned that membership growth needs to be increased, specially attracting of new members should be considered.

He suggested activating scholarship Mr.D.S.R.Tharmarathnam fund.

Mentioned that there are long outstanding payable to deceased members and he suggested writing back if there is no person to claim those.

President suggested to write back three long outstanding dues as there is no person in Sri Lanka to pay it. It was proposed by Mr.Quintes Fernando and seconded by Mr. Thushara Kariyawasam.

It was suggested by the members to discuss with the institute and send applications with members' directory. President states that we have send circulars twice but only three members responded.

10. As the final item of the agenda, the secretary was invited to deliver the vote of thank and Mr. Thushara Kariyawasam thanked all the committee members, the president and the council members of CA Sri Lanka, Ex. CEO; Mr. Aruna Alvis and current CEO Mr. Prasanna and the CA Sri Lanka staff for the support extended during last year, and Thanks to

auditors M/s B R De Silva for their honorary service & finally he invited the members to join the fellowship and dinner.

1. Our Society Completes 36 Years

The Society was inaugurated on 6th December 1983 and has now completed 36 years. During this period spanning over 36 years the Society has mobilized savings of Rs.55.70 Million from the members and has assisted them in their hour of need. During the same period many activities including lectures, outings, health camps and musical and fun activities were carried out for the benefit of the members.

We gratefully remember Mr. D S R Tharmaratnam, our founder, who dedicated himself to the cause of welfare of our members.

2. Scholarship Fund

The balance of scholarship fund as at 31^{st} March 2019 was Rs. 67,000/=. This fund is now inactive. We solicit donations to activate this fund and it is one of responsibilities to support the needy in our society.

3. ICASL Donations Fund

During the year 2018/19, the Society received a grant of Rs. 500,000 from ICASL to the Donations Fund and, payments amounting to Rs. 1,066,000 were made to needy members on approval of the Committee during this period. During April 2019 to October 2019 Society received another grant of Rs. 800,000 from ICASL and payments were made to CA members amounting Rs.240, 000 to meet their essential medical requirement. All CA members are entitled for to claim from this fund.

The Committee has decided to pay a maximum of Rs. 200,000 per member per annum, based on the requests made by CA Members for reimbursement of medical expenses for critical illness, major surgeries etc., on case by case approval of the Committee of Management.

If it is for a non-critical illness or a minor surgery the Committee would approve the claim case by case.

If any CA Member is experiencing financial difficulties and they may appeal for financial assistance from the society and the Committee would decide on the amount to be paid to such needy CA Member after carefully consideration facts.

6. New Year Festival

On 07th April 2019, the Society organized a New Year Festival Celebration for all CA Members, their families and CA Staff at the CCC Grounds, for the sixth consecutive year. Around 400 CA Members and CA staff members participated with their families. The event was a success with traditional games, such as, Singithi Avurudu Kumaraya and Kumariya competitions and with many exciting events.

The committee members were able to collect Rs. 1,037,000 as sponsorships from various institutions by using their personal contacts. Rs. 847,833 were spent on this grand event and finally on excess of Rs.189, 167 were made.

7. Medical Camp

On 21st August 2019, the Society organized a Medical camp with the Sponsorship of Lanka Hospital. Two Doctors and two dietitians came with 18 staff to conduct this camp. The event provided an excellent opportunity for our Members and the CA Staff to get an insight into their medical status.

The Medical Camp was followed by an interesting Guest Lecture on "Child Cycology" by **Dr.Udena Attygalle**, Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist of Colombo South Teaching Hospital.

8. Members' Day Outing

On 6th October 2019, the Society organized the members' day outing at Laya Beach Hotel, Wadduwa. The event was organize with many activities as members and their families may enjoy during the day. This provided a fantastic opportunity to members enjoy in a nice beach hotel.

9. FANTASY: MBS Fun Night

This event took place on July 26, 2019 gave a fantastic opportunity for members for relaxation. Members were able to enjoy with songs and Singer Saman De Silva and his team created a different environment for our members on that day. The dances took place were amazing and many members appreciated this event

10. Insurance cover

The Insurance scheme was started on 13th July 1996, giving Accidental or Natural Death benefits. At present, benefits available to the members are as follows:

The above is operative 24 hours of the day worldwide and including riots, civil commotion and terrorism.

The above Insurance cover will apply to the following category of members of the Society.

- A. Those members who have a credit balance of Rs. 25,000/= or more at any given time, and
- B. Those members who are not in arrears as at 31st March of each year unless falling under the first mentioned category.
- C. If the deceased Member is above 75 years the Member is not entitle to get the Insurance Benefit. For such Members Rs. 50,000 will be paid by the Society to the nominee.

11. Death Donation Scheme

The Society pays Rs. 300 per active members as a Death Donation to the deceased member's family, if the deceased member has been a member for over ten years. Other active members are entitled for Rs. 100 per active member. However non-active members are not entitled for death donation.

Income of the society has increased by 12.16 %. This is a significant increase compared to previous financial year. It was resulted due to high interest rates and increase of members funds compared to previous year

Rs 189,167 was transferred to Members welfare fund during the year which generated through fund razing activities to spend for member welfare activities.

14. Fund Razing Activities:

Rs 1,037,000 was raised for the New Year festival and after incurring expenses Rs 189,167 was transferred to member's welfare fund and in welfare fund there is a balance of 3,055,647 is now available for future members welfare activities as at 31 March 2019. Subsequently in 2019 April Rs. 963,750/- were raised for the New Year festival and out of this Rs. 147,943 is saved for the welfare activities for the members.

15. Share of Profits

Out of profits generated through the year Rs 3,140,332 was distributed among the members and transferred to Reserve Funds during the year 2018/19.

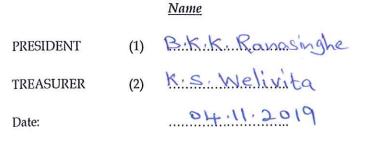

1. <u>CORPORATE INFORMATION</u>

1.1 General

The registered office of The Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka Members' Benevolent Society is located at No.30A, Malalasekara Mawata, Colombo 07.

1.2 Principal Activities and Nature of Operations

During the year, the principal activities of the Society were to grant relief and other pecuniary benefits to the members in need.

1.3 The notes to the Financial Statements on Pages (04) to (08), form an integral part of the Financial Statements.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Basis of Preparation

2.1.1 Statement of Compliance

The Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Comprehensive Income, Statement of Cash Flows together with the Accounting Policies and Notes to the financial statements as at 31st March 2019 and for the year then ended comply with the Sri Lanka Statement of Recommended Practice for Not-for-Profit Organizations (including Non-Governmental Organizations) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka (SL SoRP).

2.1.2 Basis of Measurement

The financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention.

2.1.3 Functional and Presentation Currency

The financial statements are presented in Sri Lanka Rupees (Rs.), which is the organization's functional and presentation currency.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH, 2019

2.1.4 Changes in Accounting Policies and Disclosures

The Accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated, and are consistent with those used in previous years.

2.1.5 Significant Accounting Judgments, Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, at the reporting date. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates can result in an outcome that could require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in the future.

2.2 Foreign-currency Transactions

Transactions made in currencies other than Sri Lanka Rupees are converted into Sri Lanka Rupees at rates which approximate the actual rates at the transaction date and at the reporting date.

2.2.1 Property, Plant & Equipment

(a) Cost

Property, Plant & Equipment are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

(b) Depreciation

The provision for depreciation is calculated by using the straight line basis on the cost or valuation of all property, plant and equipment in order to write off such amounts over the following estimated useful lives. The principle annual rates used are;

Telephone Equipment	10%
Computers & Printers	10%

Full provision is made in the year of purchase and none in the year of sale.

2.2.2 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Members' Benevolent Society considers cash in hand, amounts due from banks and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less to be "Cash and cash equivalents". Bank borrowings that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the Members' Benevolent Society's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the Statement of Cash flows.

2.2.3 Financial Instruments

Members' Benevolent Society classifies financial assets in to the following categories; financial assets at fair value through profit and loss, held to maturity financial assets, loans and receivables, and available for sale financial assets.

Held to maturity Financial Assets

If the Society has a positive intent and ability to hold debt securities to maturity, then such financial assets are classified as held to maturity. They are initially recognized at fair value plus any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, they are measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses.

Loans and Receivables

Members' Benevolent Society initially recognizes loans and receivables on the date that they are originated. All other financial assets are recognized initially on the trade date, which is the date that the Society becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Loans and receivables are stated at their cost net of an allowance on outstanding amounts to cover the risk on non-payment.

2.2.4 Employee Benefits

(a) Defined Benefit Plan - Gratuity

Provision has not been made in these accounts for retirement gratuities payable under the payment of Gratuities Act No.12 of 1983, since the Society is not liable for such payments.

(b) <u>Defined Contribution Plans - Employees' Provident Fund & Employees' Trust</u> <u>Fund</u>

Employees are eligible for Employees' Provident Fund Contributions and Employees' Trust Fund Contributions in accordance with the respective Statutes and Regulations.

2.2.5

Accounting for the receipt and utilization of Funds/Reserves

Reserves are classified as either restricted or unrestricted reserves.

(a) <u>Unrestricted Reserves/Funds</u>

Unrestricted funds are those that are available for use by Members' Benevolent Society at the discretion of the Executive Committee, in furtherance of the general objectives of Members' Benevolent Society and which are not designated for any specific purpose.

(b) <u>Designated Reserves/ Funds</u>

Unrestricted funds designated by the Executive Committee to a specific purpose are identified as designated funds. The activities for which these funds may be used are identified in the financial statements.

(c) <u>Restricted Reserves/Funds</u>

Where grants are received for use in an identified project or activity, such funds are held in a restricted fund account and transferred to the Statement of Comprehensive Income to match with expenses incurred in respect of that identified project. Unutilized funds are held in their respective Fund accounts and included under Capital & Reserves in the Statement of Financial Position until such time as they are required.

Funds collected through a fund raising activity for any specific or defined purpose are also included under this category.

Where approved grant expenditure exceeds the income received and there is certainty that the balance will be received such amount is recognized through Debtors in the Statement of Financial Position.

(d) Investment Income and other gains realized from funds available under each of the above categories are allocated to the appropriate funds, unless the relevant agreement or minute provides otherwise.

Income Recognition

(a) <u>Contributions/ Income Sources</u>

Income realized from restricted funds is recognized in the Statements of Comprehensive Income only when there is certainty that all of the conditions for receipt of the funds have been complied with and the relevant expenditure that it is expected to compensate has been incurred and charged to the Statements of Comprehensive Income. Unutilized funds are carried forward as such in the Statement of Financial Position.

Gifts and donations received in kind are recognized at valuation when they are distributed to beneficiaries, or if received for resale with proceeds being used for the purpose of Members' Benevolent Society at the point of such sale. Items not sold or distributed are inventorised but not recognized in the financial statements.

All other income is recognized when Members' Benevolent Society is legally entitled to the use of such funds and the amount can be quantified. This would include income receivable through fund raising activities and donations.

(b) <u>Revenue</u>

Interest earned is recognized on an accrual basis.

Net gains and losses on the disposal of property, plant and equipment and other non-current assets, including investments, are recognized in the Statement of Comprehensive Income after deducting from the proceeds on disposal, the carrying value of the item disposed of and any related selling expenses. In the case of any revalued asset, any balance remaining in the Revaluation Reserve account is transferred to the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

Other income is recognized on an accrual basis

2.2.7 Expenditure Recognition

Expenses in carrying out the projects and other activities of Members' Benevolent Society are recognized in the Statement of Comprehensive Income during the period in which they are incurred. Other expenses incurred in administering and running Members' Benevolent Society and maintaining the equipment to perform at expected levels are accounted for on an accrual basis and charged to the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

Members' Benevolent Society has adopted the "Function of expense" method to present fairly the elements of Members' Benevolent Society's activities in its Statement of Comprehensive Income.

2.2.8 Taxation

Current Taxes

Income tax is provided on 14% of Investment income.

2.2.9 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs are treated as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

2.2.10 Financial Income and Expenditure

Net financial income comprises interest payable on borrowings, if any interest receivable on funds invested, securities income and gains and losses on hedging instruments.
